

POLICY ADVOCACY

Focused on Producer Profitability and Productivity

State & Federal Policy Development

As a grassroots organization, your ICA membership allows you to play an active role in the association's policy development. These policy priorities guide the efforts we focus on throughout the year.

A Big Win: ICA's work on the Livestock Capital Gains Bill, which was signed into law, is estimated to save cattle producers \$18 million over the next five years.

The policy development process begins with member input collected throughout the year from producer conversations, our policy survey, and committee discussions. Current policy is reviewed for updates and renewal. These, along with new priorities, are brought forth to the membership at the Annual Meeting for discussion and ratification.

In a partnership with ICA lobbyist Jake Swanson, our state priorities are communicated to policymakers at the State Capitol. The 2024 Legislative Session was one of the most productive and successful sessions, marked with decisive wins for lowa cattle producers.

At the national level, our priorities guide which recommendations our state brings to the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) Convention and what policy we will collaborate on with other states. We also work directly with elected officials at the federal level to drive positive change for the U.S. beef industry.


Community
